The Church has many well-known "Saints" who have been appointed as significant people of faith. The Bible states that *all* Christians – those who trust in Jesus as their friend and king - are saints. So, whilst examining the lives of some of these saints – inspired by Christ to live significantly for him, the focus of this half-term also reflects on the question: "What does Jesus mean to me?" Time in class should allow for the children to think, discussion and participate. Encourage those who wish, to prepare something in advance. They could choose and share their own poem, song or Bible verse to illustrate what Jesus means to them. Remember, we cannot force worship but provide a Christian stimulus and opportunities to do so. There are no separate Bible passages for each day but each week's memory verse should be a daily starting point.
