St. Bart's Collective Worship Themes Summer 2: We believe in...

Throughout the life of the church, Christian belief has been summarised into short, memorable "creeds" which are still used be Christians today as a helpful way of reminding and explaining what God teaches through the Bible. One of the most comprehensive and helpful is the Nicene Creed. The Bible doesn't speak about every decision that people have to make – it explains the most important message of God's grace and how to get back into a right relationship with Him. This half-term we will start by looking at belief as a choice that people make and then work our way through the Nicene Creed to reflect on some big truths.

Do read and try to understand the entire creed and, each week, consider the full block (not just the short title given). A simple Bible reference is given for each worship time that would be good to include. The entire creed it included on the last page.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, (1 Corinthians 8:6, Ephesians 4:5) the only Son of God, (John 3:16) eternally begotten of the Father, (Colossians 1:15, 1:17) God from God, (John 1:1-2) Light from Light, (John 1:4, 1:9, 2 Corinthians 4:6, Hebrews 1:3) true God from true God, (1 John 5:20) begotten, not made, (John 1:14) of one Being with the Father. (Mark 16:19, Luke 22:69) He will come again in glory (Mark 13:26, John 14:3, 1 Thessalonians 4:17) to judge the living and the dead, (Matthew 16:27, 2 Corinthians 5:10, 2 Timothy 4:1, 1 Peter 4:5) and his kingdom will have no end. (Hebrews 1:8, 2 Peter 1:11)

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, (*Acts 1:8, John 6:63, 2 Corinthians 3:6*) who proceeds from the Father and the Son. (*John 15:26, 16:7*) With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. (*2 Corinthians 3:8*) He has spoken through the Prophets. (*1 Peter 1:10-11, Ephesians 3:5*) We believe in one holy, catholic and apostolic Church. (*Ephesians 1:4, 2:20, 4:4, 5:27, Matthew 28:19, Acts 1:8, Matthew 16:18, Romans 12:4-5, 1 Corinthians 10:17*) We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. (*Ephesians 4:5, Galatians 3:27, 1 Corinthians 12:13, Colossians 2:12-13, Acts 22:16*) We look for the resurrection of the dead, (*Romans 6:4-5, 1 Thessalonians 4:16*) and the life of the world to come. (*2 Peter 3:13, Revelation 21:1*)
